

Charlie Capps Lake 2023 REEL FACTS

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General Information: Charlie Capps WMA Lake is a 40 acre impoundment located on Charlie Capps Wildlife Management Area. The lake was drained in 2005 then re-stocked in 2010 and opened in 2013.

Location: Off Highway 8 in Bolivar County, 5 miles east of Rosedale and 15 miles west of Cleveland.

Fishery Management: Largemouth Bass, bream, Magnolia Crappie, and catfish.

Amenities

- 2 fishing piers
- Small primitive boat launch

Regulations

- All anglers except those exempt from purchasing a fishing license must have a WMA user permit.
- Only bank fishing and non-motorized boats may be used (trolling motors are legal).
- Lake open daily from February 15 – October 31 each year.

Creel Limits

- 5 Largemouth Bass per day.
- 20 crappie per day.
- 100 bream per day.
- 10 catfish per day

Sportfishing Tips

Largemouth Bass

- Target submerged structure along shoreline during the spring.
- During the summer and fall look for fish in deeper water along the dam or off from the earthen piers.

Bream

- Use crickets or red worms near the piers or in shallow water along the northern and eastern shorelines.
- Bream fishing usually best from early summer through the fall.

Crappie

 Jig around submerged structure in deeper areas of the lake, including by the drainage pipe. **Below:** Results from the 2021 electrofishing survey on Charlie Capps WMA Lake. This lake is sampled by electrofishing every 1 to 2 years during the fall. Largemouth bass catch rates decreased, however the bass that were caught averaged a greater length and weight as compared to the 2018 survey. The number of Green Sunfish also fell tremendously.





Right: Largemouth Bass length distribution for **Charlie Capps WMA** Lake from the 2021 electrofishing survey. Majority of fish collected ranged between 13 to 14 inches with a few larger fish over 17

inches.





Left: Bluegill length distribution for Charlie Capps WMA Lake from the 2021 electrofishing survey. Bluegill showed a slight variation in total length, with majority of fish at 4 inches.

Right: Largemouth Bass, Crappie, Redear Sunfish, and Channel Catfish have been stocked into Charlie Capps WMA Lake since the fish kill in 2017. Over 13,000 Bluegill were stocked in 2019. 4,000 largemouth bass were stocked in 2020.
